

The St. Albert Music Festival has added the following classes to those available in the Provincial Syllabus. These classes are either for instruments which are not recognized at the Provincial level (Fiddle/Ukulele) or for selections and/or age groups not represented in the Provincial Syllabus.

The following categories of classes are available at the 2024 St. Albert Music Festival IN ADDITION TO the classes offered in the 2024 Provincial Syllabus. Register for them in the same way as you would for a regular syllabus class. Please note that the local class numbers begin with 00 followed by the remaining three digits.

Local Festival Regulations

ALSO SEE "RULES GOVERNING LOCAL FESTIVALS" IN THE PROVINCIAL SYLLABUS

- 1. Local Syllabus Classes are not eligible for Provincial recommendation unless otherwise noted.
- 2. In ALL classes a licensed published copy of the selection must be provided for the adjudicator. Authorized internet copies with appropriate documentation are accepted. Proof that selections are part of the public domain will be accepted. PHOTOCOPIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. The published copy must be turned in at the performance venue upon arrival. Please familiarize yourself with the festival's copyright regulations, as stated on the website.
- 3. Participants entering piano classes from this syllabus may be performing in **EITHER** Piano Plan I **OR** Piano Plan II in the Provincial Syllabus.
- 4. The time and location of performances are scheduled at the discretion of the St. Albert Music Festival. The order of performers is determined by the Festival Coordinator
- 7. All participants must be at the place of performance and be ready to perform at least 15 minutes before the class time. If a solo competitor is unable to perform, no one may take his or her place.
- 5. The St. Albert Rotary Music Festival uses the following grading system:

90 and over Gold with Distinction Certificate

85-89 Gold Certificate 80-84 Silver Certificate Below 80 Bronze Certificate

- 6. The grading system is used to determine Provincial Recommendations where applicable, and is also a factor in determining scholarships and awards. Marks will be recorded in the adjudicator and secretary notebooks, but will not be included on the participant's adjudication record. Parents and teachers who wish to know their child/student's mark can send an email to the Festival Coordinator. Please note that both the parent and teacher must be included in the email.
- 7. Students entered in Preparatory, Exam Prep, Adjudication Only, Lyle Moore Classes and Workshops will receive Participation Certificates only. No marks will be given for these classes. ADJUDICATION ONLY classes are intended as a workshop experience.
- 8. Grades are based on the total performance in the class. The quality of material chosen and its suitability to the class will be considered by the adjudicator.
- 9. Memorization is encouraged but not required and may be taken into consideration by the adjudicator. It is to be noted that most classes at the Provincial level require memorization.
- 10. A protest cannot be considered unless it is made in writing directly to the local festival within 3 days of the close of the festival, and is accompanied by a \$15 fee. The fee will be refunded if the protest is sustained. At no time may anyone other than a festival official discuss the matter with the adjudicator.
- 11. Some Local Festival awards & scholarships are restricted to those who reside or are being taught in St. Albert or surrounding districts excluding Edmonton. These details can be found in the individual Award descriptions.



LYLE MOORE SCHOLARSHIP CLASS

CLASS 00400 Scholarship of \$1000 to continue advanced studies in music

Criteria:

- Open to *all* students (no residence requirements for student or teacher)
- Candidates must be Advanced Level Music Students, ages 16 to 28, and entering or studying at a post-secondary institution or equivalent level of instruction.
- Selections for **ANY** solo instrument or voice, may include concerti, with a maximum of 5 selections within a total maximum performance time of 20 minutes. Selection of a concert program displaying a balance of musical styles will be considered by the adjudicators.
- Selections chosen must be different than those registered to be performed in other St. Albert Festival classes.
- A maximum of 5 candidates will be selected to perform. If more than 5 register, the Music Festival Committee will choose 5.

Regulations:

- Entry Fee \$60
- Candidates who are selected to perform shall submit a head shot photo for publication in the Music Festival's program published by the St. Albert Gazette, and for posting on the Festival website and social media outlets at the discretion of the Music Festival.
- Candidates must submit a brief (one paragraph) biography which includes musical achievements and goals, along with personal hobbies or anecdotes.
- Candidates must identify the post-secondary institution or individual to which the scholarship of \$1000 will be paid.
- The Festival will make best efforts to appoint an adjudication panel which represents the disciplines of the performers.
- The St. Albert Rotary Music Festival reserves the right to withhold the scholarship unless a suitable candidate is identified.
- In the instance that the original recipient named by the candidate is changed, the St. Albert Rotary Music Festival reserves the right to withhold the scholarship funds until, in the opinion of the Festival, a suitable recipient of the scholarship is identified.
- Candidates are eligible to receive the Lyle Moore Scholarship in successive years.
- The winner of the Lyle Moore Scholarship in any given year is not eligible for the Rose Bowl award in the same year.

This class is eligible for Provincial Recommendation providing the repertoire performed in any discipline other than Musical Theatre is CLASSICAL as defined by the Provincial Syllabus Glossary. Provincial classes chosen for recommendation will be based on the discipline, age, performance level and/or repertoire of the performer as fits the criteria of the Provincial class. Provincial classes will be chosen by the Adjudication Panel.



STRING CLASSES

Preparatory String Solo Classes - one selection, own choice - must be below grade 1 level.

 - instrumental accompaniment is optional
- 00393 Ukulele Solo with Vocal Any Age/Any Style (one or two selections)
 - will be marked on ukulele performance (class may be divided by age if warranted by the number of entries)

WOODWIND CLASS

00402 Woodwind Solo – Adult - Own Choice – 19 & over, one or two selections

PIANO CLASSES

Preparatory Piano Classes

One selection, own choice, for beginner students.

Introductory exam level please use appropriate 'pre-grade one' classes in Provincial Syllabus

- 00911 **Self-Accompanied Vocal with Additional Instrumental Accompaniment** Any instruments, one or two selections, any style, any age (marked on total performance including accompaniment)

To be marked on Vocal performance only, please use the Contemporary Vocal classes listed in the Provincial Syllabus.



CLASSROOM CHORAL CLASSES

These local classes are to be used when performing more than one Movie/TV/Pop selection OR when the group includes mixed grade levels which are outside of the Provincial class designated grades. Otherwise use the Provincial Syllabus classes, which MAY only call for one selection. NOTE: Movie/TV/Pop is not eligible for Provincial recommendation.

Actions optional. Piano may be used as accompaniment.
